Nature of post/ Hours of Work:	<p>Part - time hours. Musician Educators may be required to deliver programmes in person and/or online, as required.</p> <p>Hours of work may vary across daytime, evening and weekends and will be discussed and notified in advance. Tuition and rehearsals may take place within school hours, outside of school hours, during weekends and/or school holidays.</p>
